Production Design Notes: There is a live violin that plays with prerecorded tracks throughout this show. There is also live tap dancing close to the audience and horns and crash cymbals within the prerecorded tracks.



Below are sections that have the tap dance sequence as well as the loud sounds. All the timing is approximate.

00:11:30-00:14:15 Dot, Hop, and String Doodle are coming up with ideas of animals to draw. When they draw a penguin, they realize that they cannot hear the penguin's footsteps. Hop then has an idea that the penguin needs taps for sound to come out and then puts on tap shoes. This introduces a whole tap dance section in which the audience is also invited and encouraged to participate!

00:15:40-00:16:10 Dot and Hop Doodle get hungry and decide to enjoy some delicious ice cream. As they are strolling, Dot drops his ice cream. Hope kindly shares her ice cream with Dot but unfortunately, that ice cream falls too. This makes Dot angry, and we hear horns blaring and cymbals crashing along with the live violin, String Doodle.

00:20:15-00:21:00 Dot, Hop, String, and Mother Doodle, go for a tandem bike ride. In this section, we hear car horns and traffic, as well as a crash sound when they all get thrown off the bike.

00:25:25-00:25:40 Dot is floating with a balloon when suddenly it pops, and we hear a popping sound. He is angered by this, and we hear horns blaring.
